Applications must be completed and on file in the Commission's Raleigh office by June 10. Applicants for positions will be given a competitive examination

later in June, and successful applicants will be given a thorough training course at the North Ca-rolina University Institute of Government training school in

Chapel Hill, Room and board will be provided and a small salary will be paid trainees during the course. Candidates completing the training course successfully will be installed as wildlife pro-tectors immediately or held in reserve until vacancies occur. Starting salary for wildlife pro-tectors will be \$2,580.00 plus ex-

pense allowances. In addition to being between 21 and 45 years of age, applicants should have at least a high school education, beinterested in wildlife conservation, and meet high mental and moral stand-
