Wildlife Body School To Train Game Protectors

The North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission and the North Carolina Institute of Government will conduct a training school for prospective wildlife protectors in June.

Men between the ages of 21 and 45 are interested in becoming wildlife protectors may apply for the training school on regular State employment application forms available at State employment offices or from the Wildlife Resources Commission, Raleigh.

Applicants must be completed and on file in the Commission's Raleigh office by June 10. Applicants for positions will be given a competitive examination later in June, and successful applicants will be given a thorough training course at the North Carolina University Institute of Government training school in Chapel Hill.

Starting salary for wildlife protectors will be \$2,500.00 plus expense allowances. In addition to being between 21 and 45 years of age, applicants should have at least a high school education, be interested in wildlife conservation, and meet high mental and moral standards.
