 2 egg whites  
 2 or 3 drops flavoring  
 Melt butter, add sugar, flavoring, flour, salt, milk, egg yolks. Mix well. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites, pour into unbaked pie shell and cook for 30 minutes in oven 350 degrees F.
