

Lackey Injured In Wreck Monday

Austin A. (Buddy) Lackey, Jr., of Fallston, husband of the former Miss Lenora Plonk, of Kings Mountain, was seriously injured in an automobile accident near Gaffney, S. C., Monday afternoon.

A passenger in the Lackey pick-up truck, Harry Gallimore, 60, of Shelby, was killed.

Mr. Lackey suffered a severely injured kneecap, it being broken in four places. He is a patient at Shelby Hospital, following emergency treatment at Gaffney's Cherokee hospital, and his condition was described as "fair" Thursday morning. He also suffered lip lacerations and one tooth was knocked out.

According to investigating officers, the Lackey truck was stopped awaiting discharge of school bus passengers, when another pick-up truck, driven by Phillip Jones, Jr., of Darlington, S. C., passed the Gaffney-bound school bus and crashed head-on into the Lackey vehicle. The Lackey truck was hurled down a 15-foot embankment.

Jones was not seriously injured. Mr. Lackey is well-known in Kings Mountain.

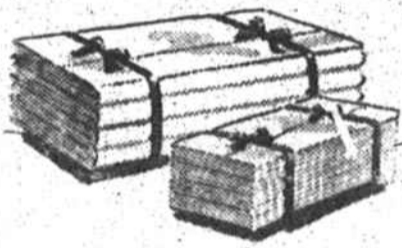
