

Cagers At Cherryville Gym Friday, Here On Tuesday

Newton-Conover Here Tuesday For Big Scrap

In what looks to be one of the most important scraps of the season to date, Kings Mountain high school's boys varsity cagers journey to Cherryville Friday night for a Western AA clash. The girls are to begin the festivities at 7 o'clock.

Coach Don Parker's quint edged Cherryville here on January 11 by 36 to 35 and have posted a record to date of 9 wins and four losses. The Mountaineers must down the Cherryville five to continue in the running for second place in the loop.

Lenoir and Shelby have also dropped four games and Cherryville has also dropped four, including Tuesday night's 45-53 loss to Newton-Conover. Newton has also dropped four contests, according to reports received here. Hickory leads the loop boys with one defeat in 10 starts.

Cherryville PCA Holds Annual Meet

The stockholders of the Cherryville Production Credit Association held their 18th annual meeting at the Shelby City Park on Feb. 15.

Secretary - Treasurer, M. A. Stroup, reported that the association had made 16,500 loans totalling \$5,590,000.00, and that reserves in the amount of \$84,000 had been built up to protect the investment of the members.

Also that the members of the association now own 95 per cent of the capital stock and reserve account, and that by the end of next year the association would be completely farmer owned. He

also reported that the association loaned its members almost \$800,000 during the past year. This being the year for the election of directors from Lincoln and Gaston counties, Mr. G. T. Wise of Lincoln County and Mr. Bruce Eaker of Gaston County, were nominated and elected to serve for a term of three years.

Mr. Eaker has just returned from Korea, and was given special recognition for his services. Report on the activities of the Board of Directors and Executive Committee was made by O. J. Holler, one of the directors of the association.
