

## Cash Is Freed In Arson Case

L. D. Cash, Kings Mountain plumber, was found not guilty of arson, by a Cleveland County Superior Court jury on March 26. The jurors deliberated for an hour before bringing in the acquittal verdict.

Cash, originally sentenced to serve from five to seven years in prison in Cleveland Superior court last year, appealed, and the North Carolina Supreme Court found errors, declaring a mistrial.

At the second trial last week, the defense successfully refuted testimony by W. H. Starnes, self-admitted dope addict, that he had set fire to the Cash home here at the instance of the owner.






