

On the state level, he served during 1948-49 as a member of the department Americanism committee and as vice-chairman of the department subversive activities committee. He was chairman

and was elected as judge advocate last summer. Before being named in 1950 to his present three year term on the National Americanism Commission, he served as a member of the National Law and Order

of the Americanism committee for two terms, from 1949 to 1951.

His activities against suoversive organizations date back to 1942, when he joined the Federal Bureau of Investigation as a special agent. He resigned from this position and entered the army in 1943, and was assigned as a special agent in army intelligence to the Security and Intelligent Division of the Manhattan Engineer District, better known as the atomic bomb project. In 1945 he was one of a small group of special agents on a special assignment to San Francisco, Calif., to handle intelligence matters in connection with the United Nations Conference on International Organization. He also was one of the special agents assigned to assist in the first atomic bomb explosion at the Alamorgordo bombing range in 1945. In this assignment he served as an intelligence supervisor.

eaten out usually is also an indication of termites. Front entrances of homes are a common point of invasion, as are wooden members in contact with soil. The swarms of termites, shiny black insects with four oversized pearly-white wings, do no damage as such, but create new colonles, says Jones. The swarm

usually lasts only a day or so.

One can sweep up the pests or

spray them with a household

fly spray. Soil arettment with a 5 per cent DDT or pentachlorophenol solutions can be done. Home owners should use concrete and not have wood and oil in contact if they want to avoid termite damage. Entomologists at State College will send bulletins and information about the pests and their control. If infestations are widespread, it may be necessary to consult commercial termite
