Treasury Raises Interest Rates On "E" Bonds Effective Thursday

Here are the changes in each of the three major fields of savngs bonds:

1. The series "E" defense bond the type held by most individuals-will be continued. Prices and maturity values will be the same—you still get \$4 for every \$3 you put in, if you hold the bond the full term. But the bond will reach full value in nine years and eight months, instead of 10 years as at present. This amounts to increasing the total interest rate from 2.9 per cent to 3 per cent annually.

Perhaps more important, the rate interest in the first few years will be stepped up sharply. The new "E" bonds can be cashed in at 1.07 per cent' interest annually after six months, 1.59 per cent after one year, 2.1 per cent after two years and 2.5 per cent

after five years. The present "E" bonds pay no interest if cashed in the first year, only .88 per cent if cashed in at two years and 1.79 per cent at five years. Advisors have told the freasury this low rate of interest the first few years has been one of the chief drawbacks to "E" bond sales.

Persons on payroll saving plans will get the new terms on all bonds delivered after May 1. get 3 per cent interest for the exended period instead of 2.9.

2. The new "H" bond, like the 'E' bond, will be sold only to individuals and will pay 3 per cent But it will be sold at par, or

face value, and can be cashed in viding regular current income to bondholders, increasing the long er the bond is held.

For a \$1,000 "H" bond, the in terest check will be \$4 after six months, \$12.50 for each of the next seven six-month periods and \$17 every six months for the next six years. The "H" bond will be put on sale June 1 at Federal Reserve Banks and the Treasury. 3. The present series "F" and

"G" bonds, which pay about 2.5 per cent interest over a 12-year term, will be replaced by series "J" and "K" bonds respectively. The new bonds will pay 2.75 per cent interest.

The "J" bond, like the "F" will be sold at a discount and reach full value only at maturity. The "" bond, like the "G," will pay interest in semi-annual pay

ments on a current income basis By providing bigger interest rate increases in the "J" and "K" bonds, and current income for the "H" bonds, the Treasury apparently hopes especially to increase sales among larger investors.
