

Former Resident M. L. Aderholdt Dies In Hickory

Funeral services for Marcus Lafayette Aderholdt, 81, a former Kings Mountain citizen and brother of J. E. Aderholdt, were held Sunday afternoon at Holy Trinity Lutheran church in Hickory.

The pastor, Rev. Hugo Dressler, conducted the rites, and burial was in Oakwood cemetery.

Mr. Aderholdt died early Saturday morning in a Hickory hospital, following an illness of several weeks.

Mr. Aderholdt, who was one of the founders of Henry River Manufacturing Co., was born in the St. Mark's section of Gaston County Dec. 11, 1871. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John Aderholdt. His marriage to Mrs. Aderholdt took place Oct. 14, 1893.

A member of the State Board of Agriculture, Mr. Aderholdt al-

so served for many years as In 1945 Mr. Aderholdt sold his farm and moved to Hickory. Mr. Aderholdt had engaged in textile manufacturing and merchandising before moving to Davidson County.

Surviving Mr. Aderholdt are his widow, the former Miss Emma Gertrude Carpenter of Gaston County, and the following children: Mrs. Glenn R. Frye, Miss Mabel and Miss Alleen Aderholdt of Hickory; Mrs. E. C. Byerly of Lexington, Mrs. M. P. Byerly of Baltimore, Md., and Dr. Marcus L. Aderholdt, Jr., a practicing physician at High Point.

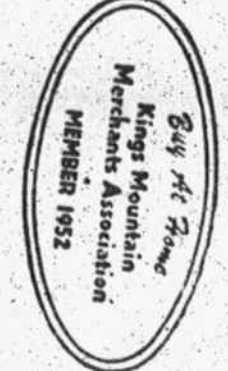

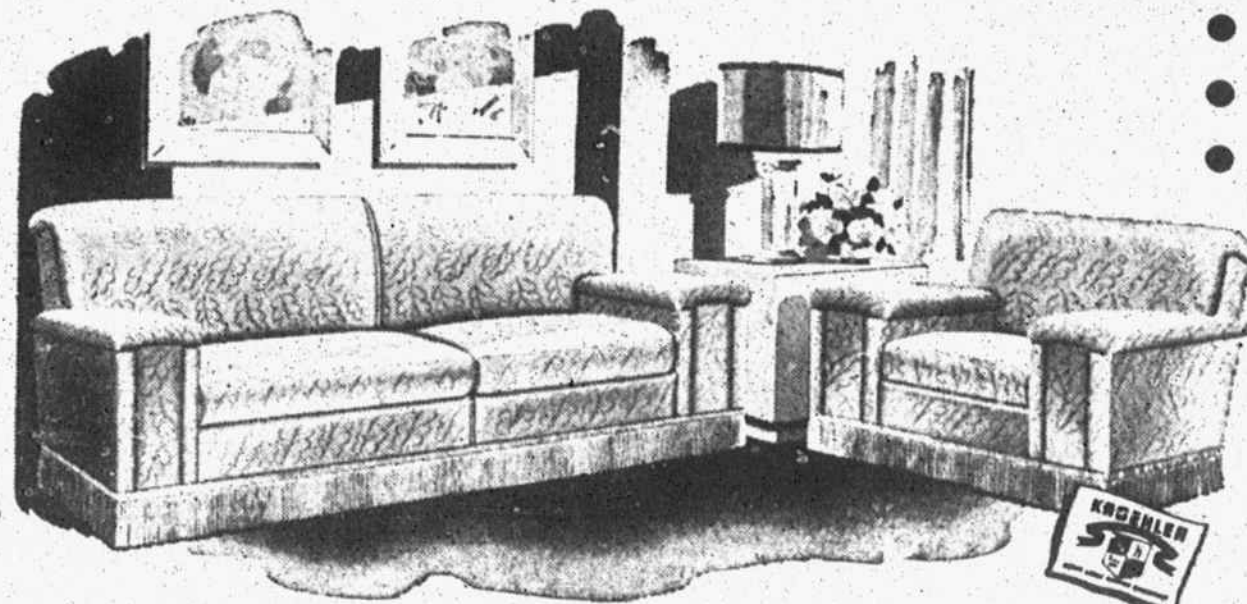
