Six Steps Listed **Toward GI Loan**

Six steps to a GI loan for nome, farm, or business were outlined by the Veterans Administration for the benefit of more than a million veterans who have been discharged from the armed services since the start of the Korean

The new Korean GI Bill, signed into law by the President on July 16, 1952, amends the loan guaranty section of the World War II GI Bill to include eligible veterans with service anywhere in the world since June 27, 1950.

Veterans Administration regional offices across the country are now issuing certificates of loan eligibility and processing applications for loan guaranty.

The six major steps to a GI loan

1. Find the property or business venture you want to buy. 2. Go to a bank, building and oan association, or other institu-

3. Present your plan and your original discharge or separation

4. Property is appraised by VApproved appraisers.

5. Certificate of reasonable alue goes to the lender. 6. If application is approved


