NOTICE OF SPECIAL BOND ELECTION AND SUPPLEMENTAL REGISTRATION in the CITY OF KINGS MOUNTAIN, NORTH CAROLINA

A special bond election will be held between 6:30 A. M. and 6:30 P. M., Eastern Standard Time, Saturday, December 6, 1952, at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Kings Mountain the following question:

Shall an ordinance passed on October 13, 1952, authorizing not exceeding \$600,000 Sanitary Sewer Bonds of the City of Kings Mountain for the purpose of providing funds for enlarging and extending the sanitary sewer system of said City, including the construction of sewage treatment plants and a pumping station, the installation of additional sewer mains and lines, and the acquisition of necessary lands and rights of way, and a tax for same be approved?

The question hereinabove set forth contains a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the ordinance referred to in such question.

If said bonds are issued, a tax will be levied for the payment of the principal and interest thereon on all taxable property in the City of Kings Mountain.

For said election the regular registration books for elections in said City will be used and such books will be open for the registration of voters not theretofore registered from 9 A. M. until sunset on each day beginning Saturday, November 8, 1952, and closing Saturday, November 22, 1952. On each Saturday during said period said books will remain open at the polling places, Saturday, November 29, 1952, is Challenge Day.

Deadline Is Set NROTC Applicants

The Navy recruiting sub-station, Spartanburg, South Carolina, has announced that November 22, 1952, is the deadline date for receipt of applications for its college training program, the Naval Reserve Officers' Training Program, (NROTC).

Competitive examinations, the seventh since the program's beginning, will be held on December 13, 1952, at test centers established throughout the nation, it was revealed by the Spartanburg Navy recruiting sub-station. Only those who have submitted their applications prior to the deadline date will be allowed to take the examination.

About 2,000 students will be selected for entry into the NROTC program this year. Successful candidates will be appointed Midshipmen, USNR, and will have their tuition, books and normal fees paid for by the government while working for bachelor degrees. In addition, they will receive pay at the rate of \$600 a year for the four-year period and will be provided the required uniforms for use while on cruises and during drill periods.

The Navy has NROTC units at 52 universities and colleges throughout the U. S. Those selected for the program will be assigned to one of these units, generally the one of their choice insofar as possible. Each applicant may submit three choices.

Applications may be obtained at high schools, colleges, offices of Naval Officer Procurement (Federal Building, Raleigh, North Carolina, and the Post Office Building, Macon, Georgia) and the Navy recruiting stations throughout the country. Completed applications must be sent to the Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey.
