At the conclusion of the meeting the hostess served hot cheese biscuits, coffee, and cake squares garnished with heavenly hash.

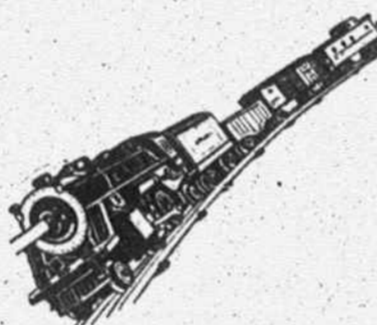

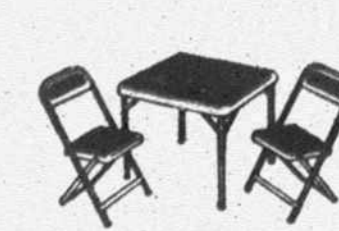

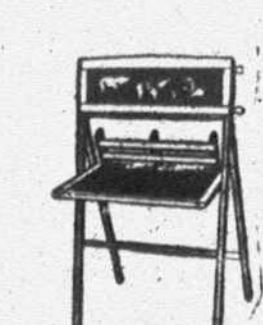
