An active churchman and lay leader throughout his life, Mr. Mauney had an especial interest in the welfare of the Lowman Home, at White Rock, S. C., a Lutheran home for the aged and infirm. He had been a trustee of the Lowman Home since 1922 and was vice-president of the board at the time of his death.

He had been named a life-time member of this board. He had served his home church in various capacities and was continuously one of its most liberal contributors, both to nominal and special projects.

He was a former member of the Kings Mountain school board, which he served for eight years, and which he had served as secretary. In 1947, he joined with other members of his family in giving to the city the Jacob S. Mauney Memorial Library and Teacher's Home.

Mr. Mauney was also interested in agriculture and operated several farms in the area.

Mr. Mauney was married on December 20, 1899, to Miss Susan Anna Isenhower, at Concordia Lutheran church, Conover, who survives.

Six children survive, including two sons, Aubrey Mauney and Dr. Jacob P. Mauney, both of Kings Mountain, and four daughters: Mrs. B. N. (Julia) Barnes, of Kings Mountain; Mrs. H. B. (Juanita) Wolf, of Charlotte; Mrs. L. L. (Frances) Lohr, of Raleigh; and Mrs. C. P. (Martha Lou) Fisher, of Rockwell. Also surviving are three brothers, R. L. Mauney, D. C. Mauney and W. K. Mauney, all of Kings Mountain; a sister, Mrs. E. C. Cooper, of Chapel Hill; 12 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

The funeral rites were conducted by Dr. W. P. Gerberding, pastor of the church, with the Rev. L. E. Blackwelder, superintendent of the Lowman Home, assisting.
