Lack Of Feed Stunts Heifers
Research work conducted at the Mountain Experiment Station, Waynesville, and at North Carolina State College during the past three years indicates that even well-managed pastures do not supply sufficient nutrients for normal growth by heifer calves between the ages of 6 and 12 months.
