The youth also received gifts from his family and friends.

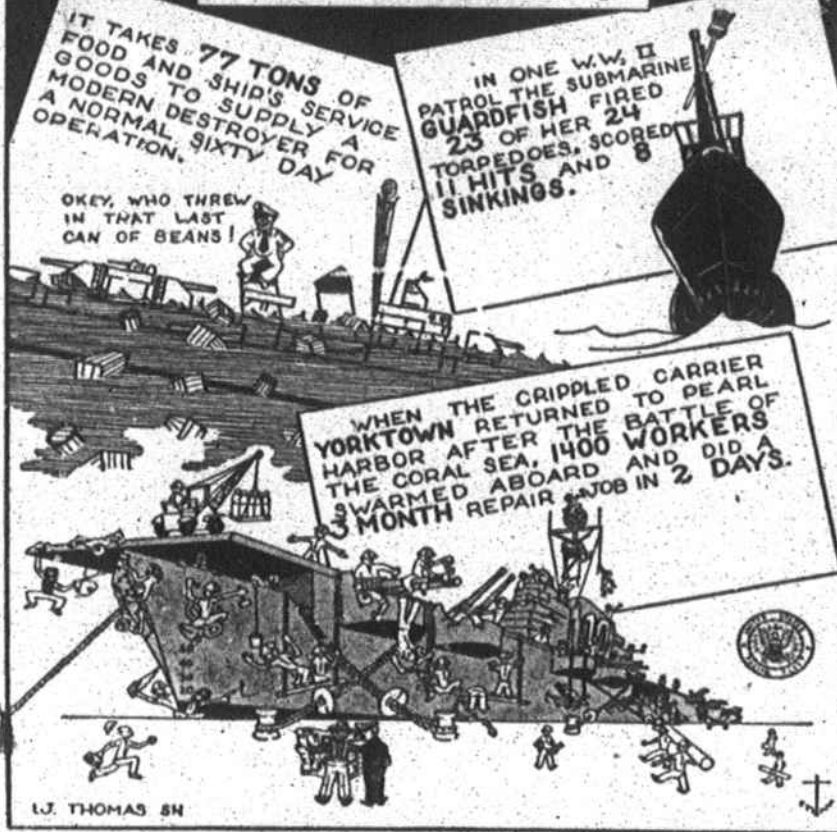
