The vows were spoken in a candlelight setting, with lighted tapers in the church windows and in seven-branched candelabra on the pulpit, which was banked with palms and floor baskets of fern, white gladioli, snapdragons and calla lilies.

The bride, given in marriage by her father, wore a ballerina length gown of nylon tulle, featuring a crystal pleated nylon tulle yoke curving above a satin bodice trimmed with Venice lace.
