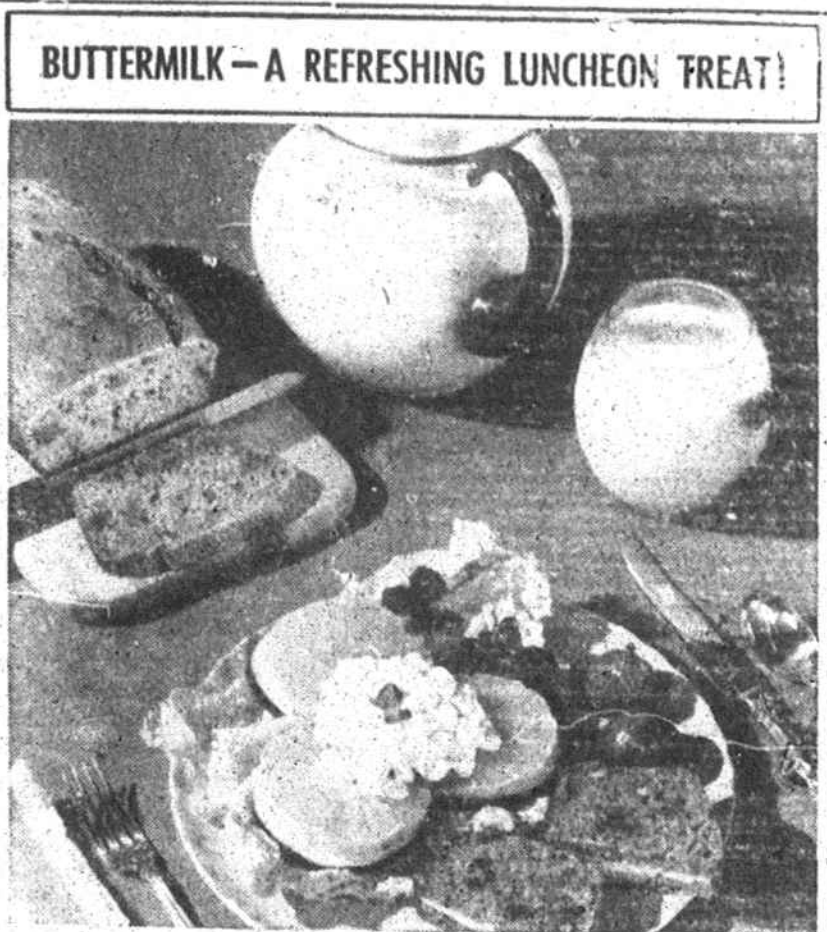

A salad of fruit and cottage cheese, homemade nut bread sandwiches and chilled buttermilk is a menu the whole family will enjoy. Buttermilk, that year 'round favorite beverage, goes into the making of this nut bread, giving a moist loaf with a delicate flavor, characteristic of buttermilk-made breads and cakes.

**ADA'S NUT BREAD**  
(quick, easy to make and inexpensive)

3 cups sifted all-purpose flour  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
3/4 teaspoon soda  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1 cup brown sugar, firmly packed  
1 cup coarsely chopped walnuts  
1 egg  
2 tablespoons molasses  
1 1/2 cups buttermilk  
3 tablespoons melted butter

Sift together the flour, salt, soda and baking powder. Add sugar and walnuts. Beat egg until thick and lemon-colored. Add molasses and buttermilk. Combine with first mixture along with the melted butter. Stir only to blend ingredients. Do not beat. This will be very thick.

Spoon the mixture into a well-buttered loaf pan, 9x5x3 inches, making slight hollow in center. Let stand 20 minutes before baking. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees) for about 60 minutes or until a wooden pick thrust into the center comes out clean. Turn out of pan onto wire rack to cool.

NOTE: One-half to three-fourths cup chopped figs, dates or raisins may be added along with the nuts.
