vision repairman, and T. W. Grayson, Kings Mountain jeweler, slipped off Friday afternoon for a try at the Cataw-ba River's offerings in the rod-and-reel department. The unusual catch was ex-

plained as follows: Mr. Stowe was tishing with a very small, two-biaded spoonspinner plug and about 20-inches of leader, with a sinker measuring an inch and onequarter about half-way on the leader.

Getting a good strike, Mr. Stowe said he reeled the catch in and after boating it, discovered the plug hanging free.


