the years, without any provision for deducting property disposals. He commended the effort of the city to set up perpetual inventory records, but added that more work should be done on allocation of costs to particular accounts as maintained by the receiving clerk and the city clerk. He said the adequacy of the records for insolvencies in the tax receivables for prior years "depends largely upon the efforts made toward collections of taxes."
