

Central Faces Mt. Holly Here Friday

Kings Mountain high school's Mountaineers are scheduled to meet the Mt. Holly high Hawks at City Stadium Friday night at 7:30 p. m.

The contest was originally scheduled for the Mt. Holly field but was transferred to Kings Mountain, at the request of Mt. Holly officials, because the field there has been sown in grass and is not yet ready for play.

Coach Shu Carlton's Mountaineers will be facing a strong team in the Hawk eleven, coached by Max Beam.

The Hawks upset strong West Mecklenburg high last Friday night 19-13 as Kings Mountain was testing a new T-formation attack against Bessemer City in a 27-6 coasting.

Back from last year's Hawk eleven, which lost to Kings Mountain 20 to 7 on a late Mountaineer splurge, is the Dink McManus-to-Benny Carpenter passing combination. The pair accounted for last year's Mt. Holly touchdown and added the first one against West last week.

McManus scored the third Hawk touchdown last week, scampering 40 yards with a recovered fumble, and handed off to Halfback Tommy McIntosh for 30 yards and the second score.

McManus attempted 17 passes last week, completed seven and had one intercepted for a West touchdown.

Kings Mountain found Bessemer City's defense likeable for its running attack last Friday and used only five passes. Coach Carlton is counting on a strong passing attack, with Quarterback Ollie Harris and George Harris tossing to several receivers, Ends Ronnie Layton and James Abernathy and Backs Don McCarter and Charles Smith.

Fullback Richard George and McCarter top Kings Mountain's ground attack.

After Friday's non-conference test, the Mountaineers start out against Western (AA) Conference opposition at Cherryville on September 25.
