Kirkwood Show Scheduled Again

Joe Kirkwood is scheduled to present a new show at Kings Mountain Country Club golf course on Thursday, October 1. B. B. Speidel, manager of the club announced this week.

Mr. Kirkwood, nationally famous golfer and trick-shot artist, appeared at the club last fall and a large number of Kings Mountain area golfers turned out for the exhibition.

The club greens committee has arranged for Mr. Kirkwood to play in a nine-hole match at 3:30 p. m. on October 1st with three professionals from the Western Carolina Golf Association.

At 5:30 p. m. on October 1st, the trickster will present his newest trick shots, an entirely new exhibition for Kings Mountain area golfers.

"Golfers from the area are urged to remember the Kirkwood date and plan now to attend," Mr. Speidel said.

North Carolina's cabbage crop has been severely damaged by insects and hot, dry weather during the last six weeks. Yield is currently estimated at 34,500 tons about 6 per cent under the August estimate.

Speeds on North Carolina highways are being checked by radar. Safe speeds are okay by the electric timer but the Highway Patrol, which is announcing the new enforcement device in signs posted along highways, is most anxious that no visitor to the State get his picture on a Highway Patrol radar showing a traffic violation. The mounting accident rate on the State's 70,000-mile highway system brought the more rigid traffic law enforcement for the protection of all users. Legal maximum speed is 55 miles an hour for cars except in specially designated areas where it is set lower because of congestion or special factors. Drivers are asked to be especially cautious in passing schools and school buses, of which North Carolina operates more than any other state. State law prohibits passing a school bus that has stopped to receive or discharge passengers.

August Bond Sales \$47,042

Combined sales of Series E and H United States Savings Bonds in Cleveland County for the month of August totalled \$47,042.00. This sales announcement was made today by County Savings Bonds Chairman Geo. Blanton,

according to the monthly sales report issued by Allison James, State Director of the U. S. Savings Bonds Division in Greensboro.

The combined sales of Series E and H Bonds for North Carolina's 100 counties for the month of August totalled \$3,412,282.75.

In commenting on the above county and state sale figures, Chairman Geo. Blanton stated

that the sale of Series E and H Savings Bonds in North Carolina were 52% higher in August 1953 than during the same month a year ago. The nation as a whole achieved a 12% increase for the same periods. Sales during the first eight (8) months of 1953 showed an increase over the corresponding months of 1952 of 30% for North Carolina, and 24% for the nation.

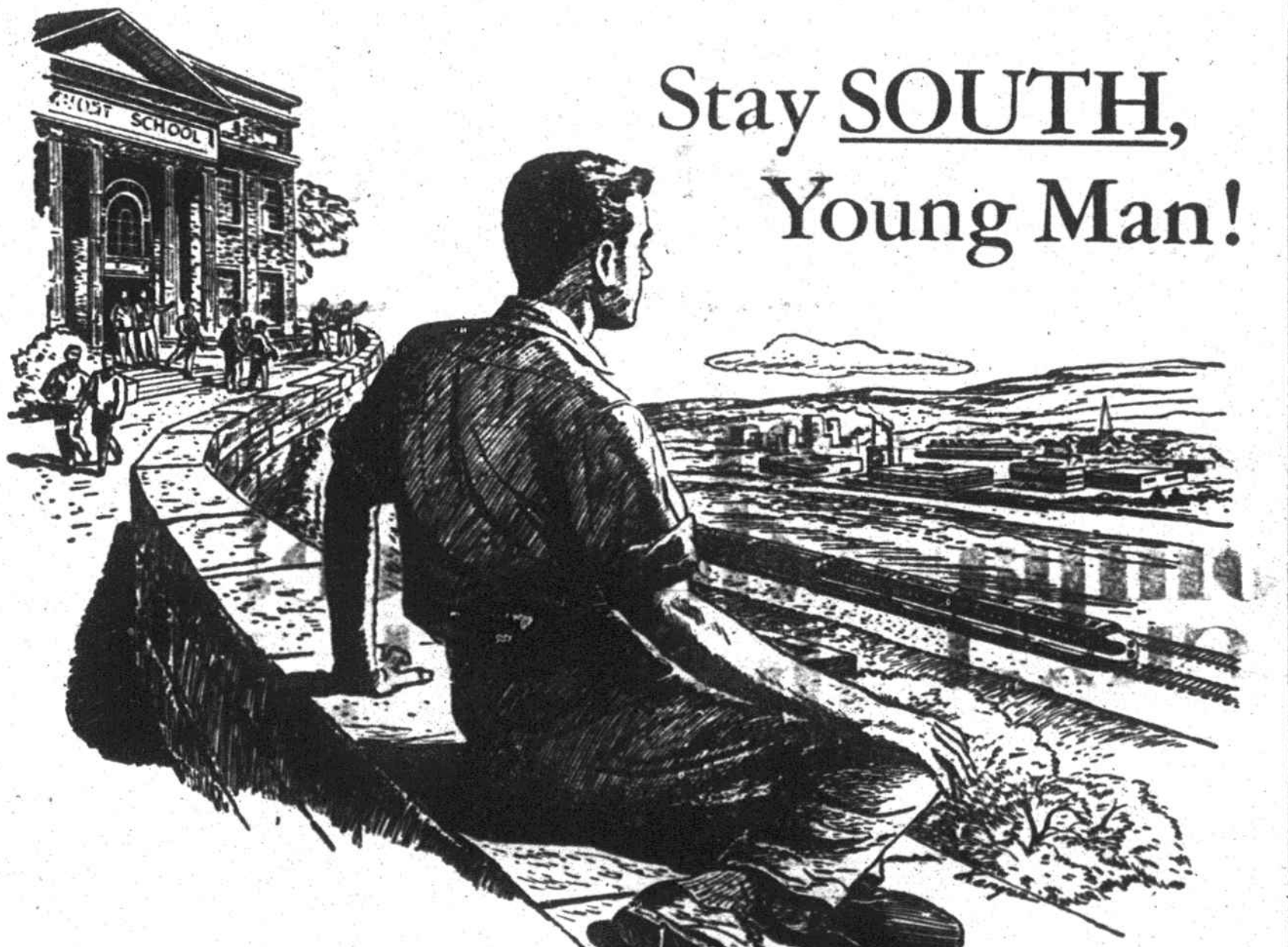
