Police Chief Gives Hints On Protection

Merchants are being asked in letters from City Police Chief H. A. Logan, Jr., to prevent break-ins, by the following suggestions:

- 1) Assign one person the special duty of locking all doors, windows or other means of entrance at closing times.
- 2) Make sure that locks are cross bars and adequate to prevent easy entrance.
- 3) Burn a night light. "Precautions should be doubled against break-ins during the winter months, Chief Logan added, and the Police Department is willing to cooperate in any way necessary to give added protection to your property."

Application for one policeman to attend a two-months police-man school at the Institute of Government at Chapel Hill during the year was also announced by Chief Logan.
