Miss Martha Joann Wright Wed Sunday To Clyde Elem Scism In Church Rites

Central Methodist Church of Kings Mountain was the setting for a formal wedding of beauty and reverence last Sunday afternoon at four o'clock uniting in marriage Miss Martha Joann Wright of Kings Mountain and Clyde Elem Scism of Lawndale.

The Reverend Phillip L. Shore, Jr., minister of the bride, heard the couple exchange vows of the double ring ritual before a background altar of Oregon fern maidens and two all-white floor baskets of white gladioli flanked by seven-branched wrought-iron candelabrum holding white lighted tapers.

Family pews were bow-marked with white satin bows tied with white ribbon streamers.

A program of nuptial wedding music was presented prior to and during the exchange of vows by Miss Bonnie McIntosh, organist, and B. S. Peeler, Jr., vocal soloist.

Organ program prior to the ceremony included "Clair de Lune", deBussy; "Largo", Handel; "Liebestraum", Liszt; "Andante Cantabile", Tschalkowsky; "I Love Thee", Grieg; "Romance", Sibelius; and "You'll Never Walk Alone", by Rodgers. "To A Wild Rose" by McDowell was softly played as vows were pledged.

Mr. Peeler sang "Through the Years" by Youmans, "Yours Is My Heart Alone", and as a benedictional prayer, "The Wedding Prayer" by Lovelace.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a floor-length princess gown of pale d'ange lace over skinner satin designed by Belle Bride, with rounded oval neckline and off-the-shoulder decolletage outlined with iridescent sequins. Her triple-tiered veil of pure silk bridal illusion was attached to a pillbox headpiece of lace and iridescent sequins, and her long-fitted gown sleeves extended into calla-lily points at the hands. Self-covered white satin buttons trimmed the gown sleeves at hand-points. She carried a white satin bound prayer book, pearl-trimmed, topped with a white purple-throated orchid and showered with lily-of-the-valley and white ribbon streamers. As ornaments, she wore a single strand of pearls with matching ear-rings.

Mrs. George Lawson Wright of Kings Mountain, the bride's mother, wore a navy dress with accessories in navy and a lavender orchid shoulder corsage.

Mrs. Clem Dixon Scism of Lawndale, mother of the groom, was dressed in a powder blue dress with accessories in navy and a lavender orchid corsage pinned at her shoulder.

A reception immediately followed the ceremony at the bride's home on West King street. Only the immediate families and close friends of the couple attended.

Pink and white carnations and vases of snapdragons decorated the home with a pink and white color note carried out in the dining hall and living room of the house.

A receiving line, composed of the bride and groom, their pa-
