Four Minor Wrecks Reported By Police

Four accidents with property damages estimated to total \$240.26 were reported by the Kings Mountain Police department this week.

On Friday, around 4 p. m., police reported, a car driven by Rufus Kiser and traveling south on Piedmont avenue was struck in the rear by a car driven by Billy Gene Ramsey after the Kiser car had made a sudden stop in order to keep from striking a car coming off Waco road. Property damages were reported to total \$32.25. Investigating officers were Jack Stone and Paul Sanders.

A second accident reported by police on Friday occurred on West King street around 6:25 p. m. According to the report, a car driven by Jack Hoover White, of Charlotte, was stopped in order to make a turn, and was struck in the rear by a vehicle driven by Carl Thompson, of E. Con. Ave., Manor Apart., Pinehurst. The Thompson car, police reported, came over a rise in the road and failed to apply brakes in time to avoid the accident.
