Pursuant to law, notice is hereby given that the assessment roll relating to SPECIAL IMPROVEMENTS MADE ON CERTAIN STREETS IN THE CITY OF KINGS MOUNTAIN has been confirmed, copies of same above have been delivered to the City Tax Collector who will proceed to collect said assessments according to law.

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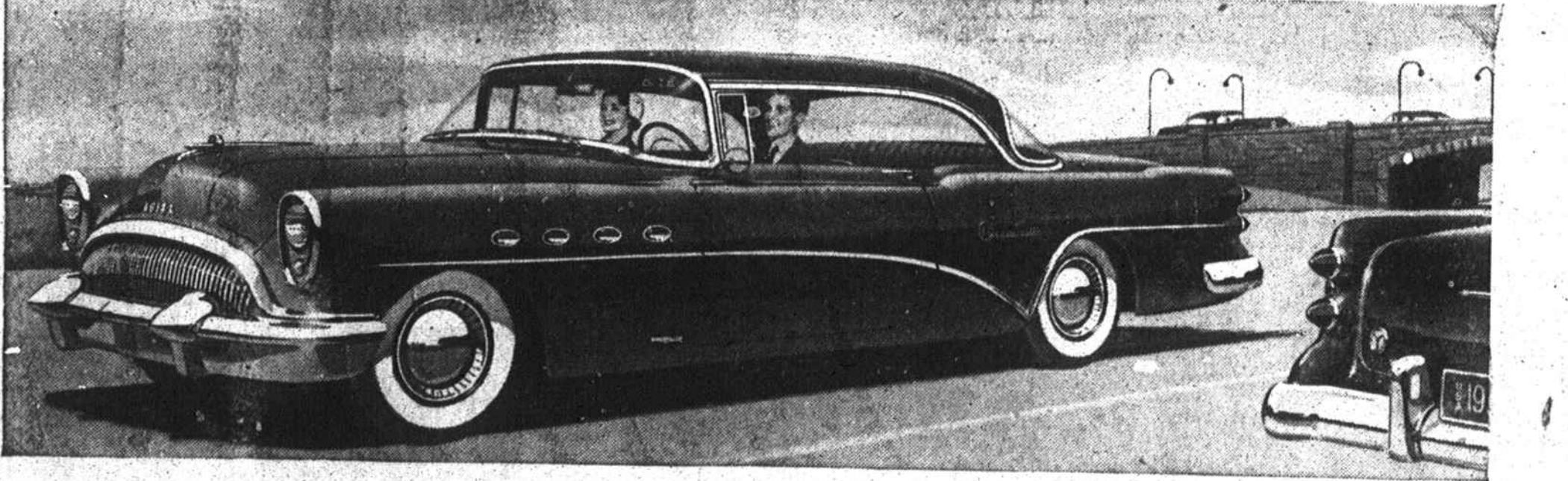
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
