**Mrs. Sam Davis Hostess To Fortnighters Club**

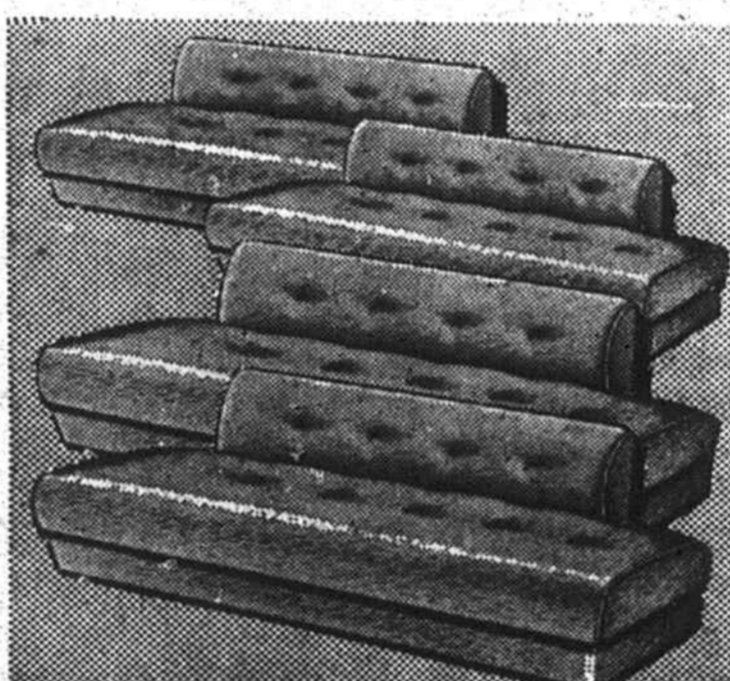
