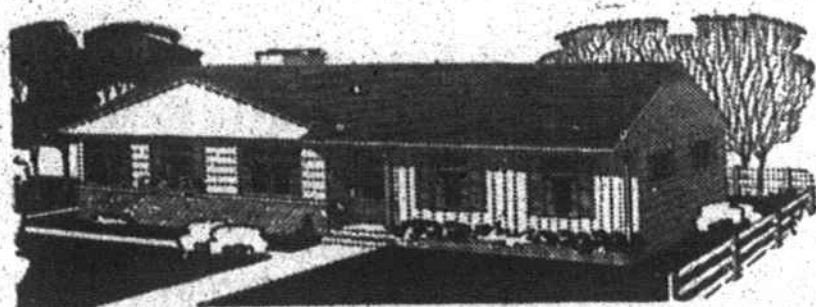
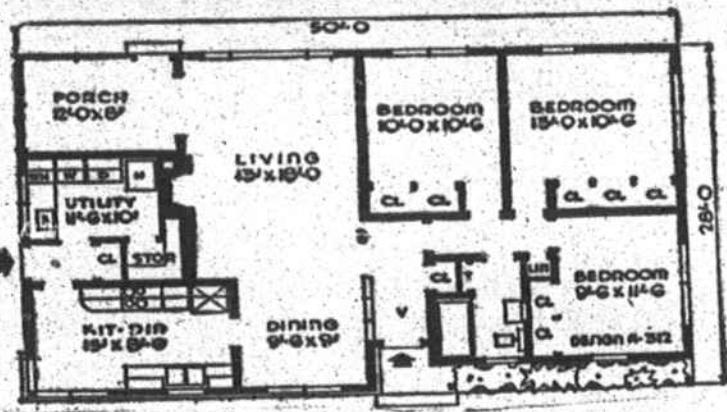

**DESIGN A-312.** This construction call for an insulated concrete slab on gravel fill, a frame superstructure finished with level siding, vertical redwood, plywood gable ends and a brick base. The compact floor plan consists of three bedrooms, bath, combination living-dining room, kitchen-dinette, utility room and a porch opening from the living room on the garden side. The storage space includes wardrobe closets, linen and towel cabinets, coat closets and general storage closet in the utility room.

Other features include the efficient galley-type kitchen, a fireplace picture window with a view of the garden, wide eave overhang, planting area and covered entrance. The floor area is 1256 sq. ft. and cubage is 15,072 cu. ft. not including the porch. For further information about DESIGN A-312, write the Small House Planning Bureau, St. Cloud, Minn.

**Social Security Checks To Show Increases With October Payments**

Joseph P. Walsh, district manager of the Gastonia Social Security Office, pointed out today that people now receiving old age and survivors insurance payments will have their monthly checks increased beginning with the check to be mailed early in October. Mr. Walsh stated that the amendments to the law passed by Congress, and signed by President Eisenhower, call for this automatic increase in benefits.

The minimum payment of \$25 to a retired worker has been raised to \$30, and the old maximum payment of \$85 has gone up to \$98.50. This means an increase in payments to retired workers of \$5 or more a month. Families of those who have died will also get increases. Where there is only one survivor drawing benefits, that is, just a widow, widower, child or parent alone, that person will receive at least \$30 a month. In some cases this will mean an increase of \$11.20 a month. The tables below give an idea of how much the increases in social security payments will be.

**Resurrection Lutheran Church Sets October As Loyalty Month**

October has been designated as "Loyalty Month" at Resurrection Lutheran church. The pastor, Rev. Douglas Fritz, revealed plans last Thursday night at the Church Council meeting for an intensified crusade to activate all members of the congregation during October.

The pastor explained, "October is Loyalty Month. It will be our purpose to reactivate every member of the congregation as well as to reach out in evangelism.
