## Red Cross Outlines Procedures Followed On Leaves, Discharges

Mrs. J. E. Gamble, executive secretary of the Kings Mountain Red Cross chapter, called attention this week to procedure requirements concerning emergency leaves and hardship discharges for servicemen on active duty.

Mrs. Gamble said that the Red Cross makes no recommendations for either, but is used by the armed forces to serve as a fact-finding and information agency.

For emergency leaves servicemen in the United States must first make application to their commanding officers, though an army man's family may make such a request, either of the commanding officer or through the Red Cross. In this instance the Red Cross verifies the facts and reports to a Red Cross field director serving the station. If the serviceman is overseas the report is submitted through channels to the military headquarters, Red Cross field director, or commanding officer of a ship.

For hardship discharges, servicemen must make their own applications, though the family is expected to file necessary statements and affidavits direct to the serviceman. The Red Cross can advise the families the necessary papers required, and, on request by the military, will obtain whatever supplementary data is asked.

Mrs. Gamble noted that decisions on both emergency leaves and hardship discharges are made solely by the military officials in charge.
