Gridders Sharper In 26-13 Win Over East Mecklenburg

Rushing, Passing Gain 421 Yards Mountaineers

Kings Mountain high's Mountaineers bounced back into the win column at City Stadium last Friday night with a convincing 26-13 verdict over the East Mecklenburg high Eagles.

Coach Shu Carlton's eleven, rebounding after suffering the first loss of the season at Forest City on October 1, scored on its first offensive series, driving 40 yards to paydirt after Center Palmer Huffstetler recovered an East fumble six plays after the opening kickoff.

Fullback Earl Valentine ran 25 yards on the first play to start things off in high gear and cracked over from the five for the touchdown and End J. L. Stewart split the uprights on his first placement try of the season.

Four plays later, the Mountaineers recovered another fumble. Linebacker Joe Ormand pouncing on the pigskin, and marched 43 yards before the drive fizzled on the East 12 as the second period got underway.

Kings Mountain held the visitors to three yards on three plays and fullback Charles Smith took a handoff from Quarterback George Harris on the punt and returned the ball 10 yards to set up the second score on the East 41.

Halfback Earl Marlowe, a thorn in the East side all night, scampered 19 yards to the 17-yard line and Smith took Harris' pass in the endzone for the six-pointers. Stewart again connected on the extra point kick, completing the

scoring in the first half although the Mountaineers marched 50 yards only to lose the pigskin on a fumble on fourth down on the East 12 shortly before the first half whistle.

In the first half, the winners rolled up 176 yards rushing to 30 for the visitors and connected for 29 yards in the air while East got 9.

The Mountaineers were sharp opening the third canto, Harris returning the kickoff 21 yards to set up a 65 yard sustained drive for the third score.

Marlowe got off a 48-yard scamper the next time the Mountaineers got the ball and Coach Carlton's second string took over but failed to drive the final 20 yards to paydirt.

The visitors generated their first threat, against the reserves.
