Re-enlistees May Get Forreastal Duty Now

Navy men re-enlisting in the near future under continuous service may, if they request, be assigned to duty in the USS Forreastal, it was learned today from the Navy Recruiting Station, Raleigh.

The Forreastal will upon its completion be the world's largest and most modern aircraft carrier. Construction is at the Newport News Shipbuilding and Drydock Company, Virginia.

While the requirements of the ship preclude a guarantee of duty aboard this "Queen of the Seas", the recruiting station said it was highly probable for men re-enlisting in the near future, providing their rates are included in ships allowance.

Ships allowance is the Naval term designating the number of men in various skills authorized as the crew of a Navy ship.

Continuous service was defined by the recruiting station as re-enlisting within 3 months from date of last discharge.

Ex-Navy men so qualifying and interested in further information concerning this opportunity are urged to contact the local Navy Recruiting office before the expiration of their 3 months period.

Couch Ordered To Get Clear Title To Auto

J. B. Couch, manager of Kings Mountain Used Car Company, received a 60-day suspended sentence in City Recorder's court Monday afternoon after being found guilty of violating section 20-12 of the motor vehicle laws of the State of North Carolina. Judge Jack White presided.

Couch was accused by Johnny Wright of failing to produce a clear title for a 1950 Chevrolet purchased several weeks ago from the used car company. In testifying, Wright stated the car, due to a motor number which could not be identified, failed to pass North Carolina motor vehicle inspection. Wright further stated that he was advised by Patrolman C. D. Fortune to park the car until the motor number could be straightened out and the car passed inspection.

Fortune corroborated Wright's testimony, but added in his opinion it would be "absolutely impossible to legally register the motor of the car in this state."

Fortune further stated the motor number was now being processed by the Federal Bureau of Auto Theft to determine if the car could have been originally stolen.

Couch's sentence was suspended on condition that he obtain a clear title within two weeks, or, if not, to pay Wright the sum of \$125 and also pay costs of court.
