In the event you do not receive your bill within a reasonable time after the first of the month, either phone or come by the City Hall and we will be glad to tell you the amount of your bill and work with you to see that your bill reaches you each month.

(2) Your gas bill is due and payable by the tenth (10th) of each month. Service will be discontinued after this date and penalty applied, if bills are unpaid.

The Gas Department suggests that customers check with gas department personnel or competent gas engineers before purchasing gas-using heating equipment. We believe this will save you much time and trouble and the Gas Department will render this service at no charge.

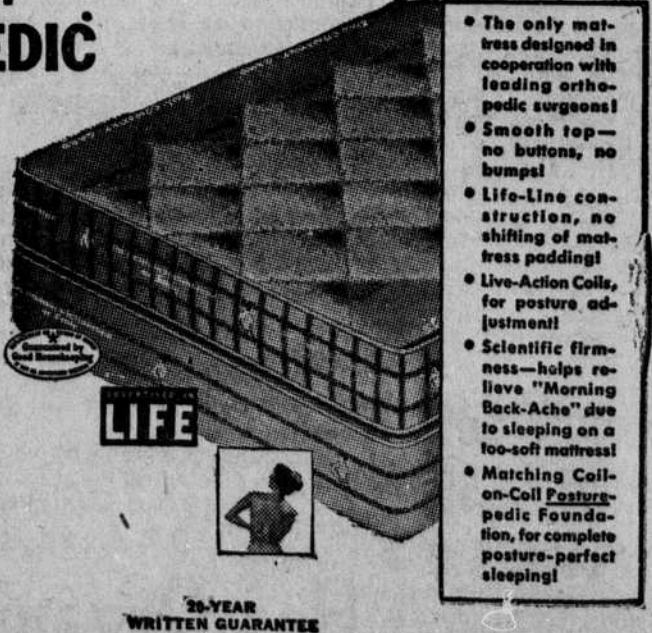
