### Area Women Are Invited To Exhibit In Flower Show Scheduled April 12

Kings Mountain women are being invited to exhibit next Thursday, April 12th, in a spring flower show sponsored by the Bessemer City Woman's club at the Woman's clubhouse in Bessemer City.

Mrs. R. Lee Lewis, general chairman of the show, announced that the show will be open to the public from 1 o'clock until 9 o'clock p. m. next Thursday night. Admission is 50 cents for adults and 10 cents for children.

Entries are being invited in the flower arrangements, horticulture, annuals, biennials and perennials; camellias, and education and conservation division of the show.

Horticulture exhibits are open to anyone, and all exhibits in horticultural classes must be grown by exhibitor and labeled if possible. Potted plants must have been in possession of the exhibitor at least three months and containers will be furnished for horticultural classes except for camellias.

An exhibitor may make only one entry in each class except in unlisted classes where each variety is to be judged against its kind, according to Mrs. Lewis.

No state conservation material is to be included in any exhibit. A flower arrangement implies the use of fresh plant material without accessories. A base or stand is permitted.

All entries must be placed between 8 o'clock a. m. and 11 a. m. Gettys Gladden.
