Prime interest in the special election concerns the first of four amendments. Amendment No. 1 embodies the principal elements of the Pearsall Plan, which mempers of the legislature and the Governor say is North Carolina's only means of legally circumventing de-segregation in the public schools and, thereby, to preserve the state's public school system.

The other amendments have attracted little interest. One would change the date of convening of the General Assembly to February of each biganium, from Jan. uary. Another would permit husbands to convey power of attor-ney to their wives. A third would increase slightly the compensa-tion of members of the General Assembly.




