Bill Haley's Rock and Rollers Schedule Three Fair Appearances

Rock and Roll is coming to Gaston County and the Spindle-Center Agriculture Fair on September 12, 13, 14.

Bill Haley and his Comets will be the featured attraction at the grandstand. They will be on hand for three nights, . . . Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

Haley and His Comets are already established as kings of "rock n' roll" music and have proved to be the hottest record sellers in the business in the last 12 months. They have sold over five million records on the Decca label.

Scheduling of Haley's Comets was announced by Howard Robbins, manager of the Spindle-Center Fair, now in its fifth year. Robbins said that 4,800 new seats were being added to the present grandstand.

We have some wonderful exhibits to be shown this year, Robbins said, and the fair will be much improved over last year in this respect. He called attention to an atomic energy exhibit to be shipped from Oak Ridge, Tenn. Also, a Nike guided missile will be exhibited, along with numerous educational exhibits from the Department of Agriculture in Washington.

Gaston County's Fair grounds are located on U. S. Highway 29, at the Lowell overpass, just outside of Gastonia. The 1956 Fair opens on September 10th.

War Orphans Can Obtain School Aid

President Eisenhower signed a bill on June 29, 1956 which awards \$110 monthly up to thirty-six months while the child of a serviceman or veteran of World War I, II or Korean Conflict is attending school, providing the parent's death was the result of service. A child, for these benefits, means a legitimate child, or child legally adopted by the parent and so forth, who is less than twenty-three years old on June 29, 1956. Being married is not a bar to these benefits. These payments are effective from October 1, 1956 for those applicants who are attending school.

These benefits are for use usually while attending business, trade, vocational schools, or colleges above secondary school level. Schooling above the usual four years of college degree may be obtained under this law. Also, there may be vocational rehabilitation in specialized schools or on job training offered where the child is determined to be vocationally handicapped.

Due to the procedure to be followed by applicants entering schools and institutions to obtain these benefits, the eligible person should apply immediately to the County Veterans' Service Office, Chalmus L. Miller or the office of the North Carolina Veterans Commission, Ervin Building, Morgantown.

CHILDREN NEED COMFORTABLE CLOTHING—Before making children's clothes at home or buying ready-mades, careful planning is necessary, says Julia McIver, Extension Specialist in Clothing, N. C. State College.

Ease in cut, and comfort in design and fit help children forget themselves at play. Children shouldn't have tight fitting belts, necklines, or sleeves. A child has no waistline, and a sash or belt constantly coming undone is a nuisance to a little boy or girl. Too large garments are as uncomfortable as too small ones. Clothing that allows for movement and growth, Miss McIver tells us, will have:

- Fullness across the shoulders and chest.
- Looseness through the waistline.
- Ample length in the crotch. Enough room to allow easy bending and stooping.
- Loose necklines, cut low at the front.
- Good-sized armholes and sleeves.
- Weight of the garment supported from the shoulders.
- To allow for growth, look for:
 - Loose armholes and sleeves (preferably the raglan sleeve).
 - Large hems.
 - Plaids.
 - Boy's blouses with extra length to provide for moving down

buttons as the boy grows. Adjustable features such as straps on suspender skirts and straps on coveralls.
