ASHEVILLE — Registration dates for the 1956-57 sessions of The Plonk School of Creative Arts, One Sunset Parkway, Asheville, have been announced by Miss Laura and Miss Lillian Plonk, directors of the school. Registration for the pre-school, primary, elementary and intermediate grades will be held on opening day Thursday, and registration for the junior and senior high school and college on Friday.

In addition to Miss Laura and Miss Lillian Plonk, members of the faculty who were with the school last year are Mrs. John Stevens, English, history and civics in the high school; Miss Cordelia Camp, intermediates grades, and Mrs. John F. Till, primary grades. The pre-school teacher and pre-school activities will be announced later.

Miss Patricia James will again teach Dalcroze eurythmics, piano, school music and French. Mrs. C. R. Bailey will teach Spanish. Mrs. D. P. Vining will teach art classes in drawing, sketching and pastels.

By special arrangement with the Staley College of the Spoken Word, Boston, the Plonk School graduates, may, by completing the education courses required for teachers, receive their liberal arts degree in one year.

Veterans are accepted through special contract with the Veterans Administration under Public Laws 16 and 550. Special evening classes will open on October 18th for teachers, professional people, ministers, high school students and others who cannot attend the morning College classes.

The Plonk School of Creative Arts was founded in 1924 to enable students to achieve training in "Living as well as in Learning."

The administration building has been redecorated in preparation for the new school year.

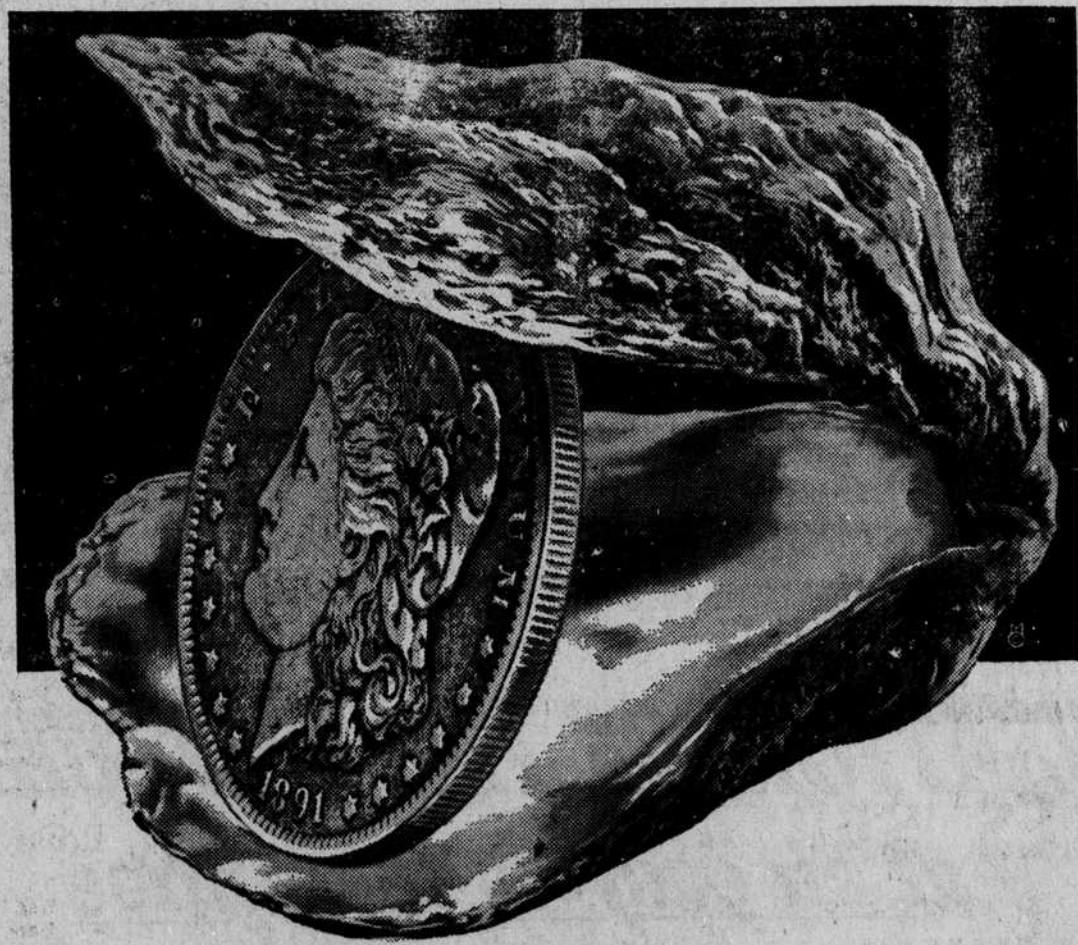
