Neville To Speak To Presbyterians

Rev. William G. Neville, missionary to Brazil, will speak at First Presbyterian church at the morning worship service at 11 o'clock Sunday morning, and at Dixon Presbyterian church at 3:45 p. m. Sunday afternoon.

Mr. Neville arrived in the United States in May 1956 on furlough from the North Brazil Mission of the Presbyterian Church, U. S. In Brazil he superintends an evangelistic field and engages in colportage work, besides teaching in the Bible institute.

Born in York, S. C., he is a graduate of the University of South Carolina and of Columbia Theological Seminary. He has served in the U. S. Air Force. He will return to the mission field in the early summer of 1957.
