## Home Accidents Rate Is High Survey Shows

Be it ever so humble, there's no place like home — despite the accident statistics.

The statistics might make you wonder about "home, sweet home."

1. Home accidents kill more children 1-4 years of age than any disease.

2. Home falls take 12,000 lives a year.

3. Home fires and other burns take the lives of 5,500 persons annually.

4. Accidental poisoning in the home claims 1,000 victims a year.

"Home accidents," the National Safety Council reports, "kill 27,000 persons a year, and injure more than four million."

"In view of these facts," the Council said, "you may well be concerned with the safety of your home."

"But when you stop and consider the great number of hours spent in the home, the statistics are more understandable even if the danger is just as real."

A hazard-free home, the Council said, results from practicing the safe way of doing things. "You'll soon do them automatically," it predicted.

Here are some danger signals to watch out for in the home:

1. Water or grease on the kitchen floor.

2. An unlighted stair, or toys and boxes piled on stair steps.

3. Oily rags or papers left in a corner of the basement.

4. Dull knives, which are dangerous because they force the user to apply too much pressure, and because most people don't have the proper respect for them.

5. Pots on the stove, the handles turned out for little hands to grab.

6. Rubbing alcohol, candy-coated laxatives, and aspirin left for small children to sample.

## Prevent Falls With These Tips

Old folks at home can be a problem. Many have failing eyesight, deafness, stiffening of the joints and muscles, diminished sense of smell and other physical failings.

According to the National Safety Council, such failings contribute annually to thousands of accidental home deaths.

Nearly 15,000 persons more than 65 years of age die each year in home accidents. About 11,500 are victims of falls. Fire burns and other deaths associated with fires accounts for about 1,500 deaths a year. Accidental poisonings, too, are a big problem among oldsters.

How can you help senior citizens safe?

To prevent falls, the Council said:

1. Increase the amount of light on stairs. Put a light by an oldster's bed.
2. Remove slipping and tripping hazards.
3. Install hand rails and grab bars in bathrooms and hallway.
4. Make sure there's a clear path from bed to door.

Burns and fire deaths can be prevented by:

1. Following manufacturer's directions for installing and operating home heating equipment.
2. Making sure older persons know the best escape route from the house.
3. Working out a plan for family members to aid an oldster in case of emergency.
4. Installing a home fire alarm for early warning.

Poisonings can be prevented, the Council said, if people will take these precautions:

1. Store internal and external medicines on different shelves in the medicine cabinet.
2. Store household cleaning agents away from food or seasonings.
3. Keep just one night's supply of medicine by the bed. That way, there's no chance of an overdose.
