

Visitors To Park Set New Record

Visitors to Kings Mountain National Military Park set a record in 1959, Ben F. Moomaw, superintendent, has reported.

Mr. Moomaw noted that some 172,387 visitors from 50 states, 25 foreign countries, and two territories came to the park during the year just ended. Travel during the month of De-cember was 4,998, a record of 18 percent over last year. The yearly figure was 11 percent a-head of the 1958 total. Park officials noted that the

visitor traveling the greater distance was from Tasmani, below Australia.
