The government of Korea has sponsored a special anniversary service celebrating the 75th anniversary of Protestant missions in Korea.

Some 450 missionaries of all denominations came to Seoul, the capitol, where they were honored by the government with the commemoratory service, dinner and a performance of Korean folksongs and dances. Among them was a Presbyterian, U. S., missionary, Mrs. George T. Brown supported by Kings Mountain's First Presbyterian Church.

A congratulatory speech by President Syngman Rhee was read. And the assembled mission-ary community was thanked for their own and their predecessors' labors in introducting the Christ-

ian faith to Korea.

Missionaries said this may have been the first time in the Church's history that a government has sponsord such a program.

The Korean church is said to be the largest Protestant church in Asia, and Seoul holds the greatest number of churches in proportion to population of any city in the world.


