





A request for an injunction against Cleveland and Kings Mountain City Schools to call a halt to consolidation of Number 4 Township schools is slated to be presented before a Superior Court judge for ruling Friday,

The petition will call for restraining both boards from continuing with effecting the consolidation as approved in a special election May 14.

Attorneys presenting the peti-tion for the restraining order are Falls, Falls, and Hamrick and A. A. Powell, both of Shelby.

The attorneys were retained by a committee of patrons from Grover and Bethware schools who wish to invalidate the May 14 election in which incoming school districts to the City Ad-ministrative Unit vote 1120 for and 879 against the merger.
