

Two 7-ounce cans tuna, drained; ¼ cup butter or margarine, 1 cup sliced onions, one 12-ounce can whole kernel corn, one 1-pound 13-ounce can tomatoes, 1 teaspoon dry mustard, 1 teaspoon salt, ¼ teaspoon pepper, 1 quart milk.

Tuna chowder adds warmth to you and your spirits.

Break tuna into pieces. Melt stirring occasionally. Gradually add milk and heat to serving temperature over low heat stirring constantly.
