

Farmers Voting December 13th

Cleveland Cotton Growers will vote at local polling places Tuesday, December 13, on their cotton program for 1961.

In order that farmers will be fully advised before that referendum date, 1961 farm acreage allotment notices will be in the hands of all cotton growers not later than the 6th of December according to Ralph Harrill, County Office Manager for the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Committee.

In a change from the programs in effect for 1959 and 1960, each farm operator will receive only one allotment for 1961. This will represent the farm's share of the

national upland cotton acreage allotment of 18 1/2 million acres. The allotment determines the effect of marketing quotas on the individual farm.

If marketing quotas take effect as a result of a two-thirds favorable vote in the referendum, cotton from complying farms may be marketed without penalty and is eligible for the full available rate of price support. Even if quotas are disapproved, compliance with the acreage allotment will determine eligibility for the lower rate of price support available.

For the past two years, farm operators had a choice between the regular allotment and price support rate and a larger allotment with a reduced rate of support. However, the law that provided this special program applied only to the 1959 and 1960 crops.

Here Are Hints In Buying Pants

To earn the best possible mileage from your pants investment there's an inside story of quality as well as the outside one of basic good appearance to be considered.

Often the purchaser is confronted with several makes of pants in identical fabrics but differently priced. It's not the fabric but the garment construction that tells the whole story.

Here's where inside sleuthing produces the important clues standing for quality tailoring that represent a "good buy".

1. Seams — There are no raw seam edges. The quality seam is pressed flat, eliminating bulk and making alterations easier. In the seat back, the seam al-

lowance is generous all the way down to allow for letting out if good living should result in Pop needing more seat room.

2. Pockets — Deep and roomy, of sturdy cotton drill; they are double-stitched for added strength to stand up for the usual collections of nails, knives, and change. It is important that the word Sanforized is stamped on the pocket drill.

3. Waistband — Here, again, the Sanforized stamp on the lining is a promise against any uncomfortable waistline cinching from shrinkage.

4. Belts — Often interlined for a firm shape so they won't "curl" in action.

5. Darts — Bias darts from the waistband down into the back pockets give a trim shapely line.
