

At a time when there is much stress upon brotherhood and a too conspicuous lack of it both at home and abroad, it is worth while to consider the Bible, and especially the Jewish scriptures of the Old Testa-

In this, as in many other matters, the Bible has a piomatters, the Bible has a ploneer aspect as a textbook of

The New Testament, of
course, is the crowning treatise
of love and brotherhood, in the

example and teaching of Jesus. And such examples as offered by the apostolic brothers, James and John, and Peter and Andrew, are of particular in-

But the Old Testament, from the stories of Abel and Cain, of Jacob and Esau, and the nobler examples of Moses and Aaron, and of David and Jonathan, tells of brothers, in tragedy and triumph. And there are the brothers of Joseph, famous and infamous, one at least of whom tried to save though the others sold

him into slavery. This is a part of the record of blood brothers, but broth-erhood in the Old Testament had a significant meaning in the conception of a closely knit Jewish social life, in which individuals had a mutual responsibility for the welfare of all.
