Bloodmobile Here For Visit Friday

The Red Cross bloodmobile will return here for a one-day collection on Friday from 11 a. m. until 5 p. m. at Kings Mountain Baptist Church.

Goal of the visit is 200 pints of blood, enough Red Cross chapter officials are hopeful to erase a 116-pint deficit from last year and furnish the 30-needed for a Kings Mountain man to undergo open heart surgery.

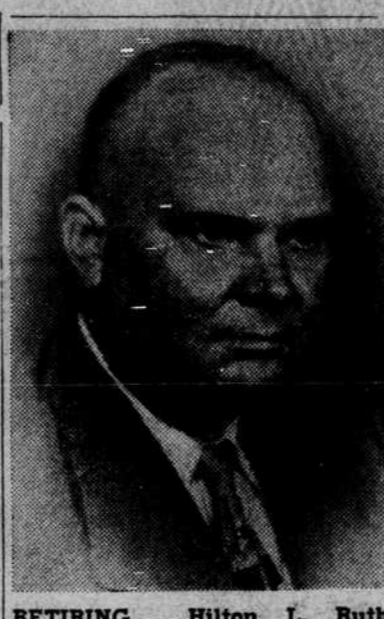
Blood Program Chairman Marion DuBose again stressed this week the need for a successful visit of the bloodbank Friday.

Further commenting, Mr. DuBose noted that last year Kings Mountain area citizens gave a total of 673 pints of blood and required 789 pints of blood from usage at Shelby, Gastonia, Charlotte and Kings Mountain hospitals.

Lions Heard Mayor Dixon

The Dixon administration has not forgotten requests to re-light the city, Mayor Kelly Dixon told members of the Lions club Tuesday night, but regards distribution system improvement as both mandatory and first priority.

He worked in the shoe and men's wear departments before becoming manager of the store at Catawba college. He and his wife, the former Betty Horton, are both natives of Mt. Ulla. They are members of Amity Lutheran church, where Mr. Brown is a member of the church council and a Sunday school teacher.

He had first revised his life as a farm boy, carpenter, depression-dictated railroad and textile worker, to builder, lay minister, and candidate for the United States Congress. He said his experience in the 1960 campaign, even though unsuccessful, dictated his entry into the mayoral race last spring.

County Polio Chapter Officials Smile As \$17,000 Gift Received

Officials of the Cleveland County Chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis were smiling this week on receipt of a check for \$17,000 as an emergency contribution from the National Foundation.
