

Hobgoblin Punch



Heat spices and cider to boiling point. Remove from heat; stir in sugar if desired. Cool. Add orange juice. Serve chilled with ice cubes and clove-studded orange slices as decoration. Yield: 2 quarts (16 1/2-cup servings)

| 1 package white seven- minute frosting mix | Food coloring (optional) | |

Prepare spice cake mix according to package directions, sub-stituting orange juice for the required liquid. Turn into small paper-lined cupcake pans and bake according to directions for cupcakes. Cool. Prepare seven-minute frosting mix, substituting orange juice for liquid called for and adding 1 tablespoon grated Florida orange rind. Add food coloring to tint orange if desired. Spread over cupcake tops and decorate with candy Halloween figures. Yield: Approximately 3 dozen.


