

G-W Pays Tribute To Max Gardner, Jr.
 BOILING SPRINGS — Resolutions in appreciation of the efforts of the late O. Max Gardner, Jr., were formulated in the Gardner - Webb Board of Trustees meeting Nov. 28, 1961, copies of which will be sent to Gardner's family, local and state papers, and North Carolina Baptist pub-

lications, "Biblical Recorder" and "Charity and Children."
 The Resolutions read as follows:
 "Whereas, O. Max Gardner, Jr., was a dedicated supporter of Higher Education in general and Gardner-Webb College in particular, and
 Whereas, O. Max Gardner, Jr., continued to serve the cause of Higher Education even though he labored under the severe hor-

dicap of physical infirmity, and
 Whereas, O. Max Gardner, Jr., maintained a glowing faith in God, his church, his country, his local community and Gardner-Webb College as long as he lived, and
 Whereas, O. Max Gardner, Jr., made provision in his last will and testament for the future of Higher Education in general and Gardner-Webb College in particular.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:
 1. That the Trustees of Gardner - Webb College in session November 28, 1961, express their heartfelt sympathy to the family of O. Max Gardner, Jr., and their deepest gratitude for the Christian example set forth in the conquering faith possessed by O. Max Gardner, Jr., and
 2. That it be recorded in the Book of Memory of Gardner-

Webb College, that O. Max Gardner, Jr., served as a member of the Board of Trustees, Treasurer of the Board, and Honorary Chairman of the 1959-61 successful expansion program, and that he expressed a tangible interest in the student body, the faculty, and the physical development of Gardner-Webb College, and
 3. That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the family of O. Max Gardner, Jr., to Mrs. O. Max

Gardner, Sr., to the local and state papers and the "Biblical Recorder" and the "Charity and Children," and that it be permanently recorded in the official records of the Board of Trustees of Gardner - Webb College.
 The resolutions were signed by President E. Eugene Poston, Chairman of the Board Mrs. Rush Stroup, and Secretary of the Board J. C. Hames.

Philipp Named By Celanese

Celanese Corporation of America today announced the appointment of Dr. Howard J. Philipp as Corporate Planning Director, a newly created position.

Establishment of the new planning post reflects management determination that Celanese corporate growth in profitable business areas be continued during the future on a sustained basis, it was stated. In his position, Dr. Philipp will explore and evaluate new growth opportunities and coordinate planning for their exploitation.

Also announced were appointments by Celanese Fibers Company, a division of the Corporation, of Dr. Reiner G. Stoll, as Vice-President, Administration and Planning, and of Henry E. Wessel, as Assistant Director of Marketing, Plans and Programs. Dr. Stoll succeeds Dr. Philipp and Mr. Wessel, formerly Market Planning Coordinator for the Corporation, succeeds Dr. Stoll.

Dr. Philipp, who joined Celanese in 1945, has been in charge of Celanese Fibers Company for two years prior to his present appointment. Previously, he had served Celanese in Cumberland, Md.; Summit, N. J.; Narrows, Va.; Charlotte, N. C., and New York City, in various development, quality control and technical capacities.

A native of Austria, Dr. Philipp was educated at the University of Vienna, obtaining his Ph. D. degree in physical chemistry for that institution in 1935. For three years following graduation, he served successively as a research assistant at the University of Vienna and the University of Zurich, Switzerland.

Coming to the United States in 1939, Dr. Philipp spent one year as a research chemist with Rayon Laboratories, St. Paul, Minn.; three years as a chemist and production manager with J. T. Gibbons, Inc., New Orleans, and two years in fiber research with the Southern Regional Research Laboratory of the U. S. Department of Agriculture, in New Orleans.

Dr. Philipp is a member of the American Chemical Society and past chairman of the Lackawanna sub-section of the North Jersey section of A. C. S.

Dr. Stoll, who joined Celanese in 1951, had been in his most recent fibers position for the past six months and previously had spent six years as director of the Celanese Fibers Application and Product Development Laboratories in Charlotte.

A native of Germany, Dr. Stoll was graduated in engineering science in 1935 from the Technical University, Stuttgart, and did post graduate work in textile and fiber technology at the German Research Institute for the Textile Industry, Reutlingen. From 1938 to 1945 he was in charge of textile research, quality control and technical service for the South German Rayon Corporation.

In 1946 Dr. Stoll came to the United States to assist the Quartermaster Corps in research work on the development and improvement of military textiles. He joined Celanese in 1951 as head of the Fibers Research Section at the Central Research Laboratories in Summit, N. J. He served as assistant manager of the Summit Laboratories from 1953 until becoming director of the Charlotte laboratories in 1955.

Mr. Wessel assumed his post of Market Planning Coordinator upon joining Celanese six months ago. He had spent 20 years previously in the chemical industry, in various production, engineering and market research capacities at Monsanto Chemical Company and in development management at Stauffer Chemical Company.

He was graduated from Illinois Institute of Technology in 1941 with a B. S. degree in chemical engineering. He is a member of the Commercial Chemical Development Association and the Chemical Market Research Association.
