Five Mountaineers In Bi-Conference

Coach John Gamble will send five of his trackmen to Shelby Friday afternoon to represent the Southwestern AAA Conference in a bi-conference meet with representatives from the Northwestern Conference.

The five members of the Mountaineer track and field squad participating in the bi-conference affair were among the top qualifiers in last week's conference meet on the Shelby oval.

Alton Stewart will run in the dash events (100, 220, 440); Robert Whisnant will run in the 180 yd. low hurdles and the 880 in the rack events.

In the field events Calvin Lockridge will be in the high jump; Dennis MacAbee will broad jump and Eddie Ross will put the shot and throw the discus.

Kings Mountain had several other qualifiers, but Coach Gamble does not plan to use them due to their junior high status.

Legion Drawing Radius Shrinks

The Kings Mountain American Legion baseball program suffered twin setbacks recently with the disclosure that both Bessemer City and York plan to field teams this season.

In past years the local Legion team has profited from the talent produced in these two areas.

If the two towns do enter teams, the drawing radius for the Kings Mountain team will be cut to one high school, Kings Mountain.

Coach Bill Powell, however, refuses to be pessimistic over the outlook. In conversation with the Herald Tuesday afternoon Powell stated that prospects are still extremely good for a winning team in Kings Mountain this year.

Powell disclosed that the local team will have the services of Beattie Leonard for mound duty this season.

Leonard, whose father was transferred here by the State Highway Patrol, is presently a member of the Lillington High School team. Among his mound appearances thus far in the '62 season Beattie list one no-hitter and three one-hitters.

In Legion play last year Leonard registered 120-plus strikeouts in posting a 10-0 record for the Harnette County nine.

Coach Powell also announced a change in the date of opening drills. Previously scheduled to begin May 19, opening workouts will be held Wednesday, May 16, at 4 p. m. in City Stadium.

Four practice tilts are already scheduled for the local team. Shelby and Cherryville will be played on a home and home basis before the start of the regular season play.

Church League To Be Formed

A meeting will be held Monday night, May 7, at 7 p. m. at Macedonia Baptist Church for the purpose of discussing the possibility of organizing a Junior-Intermediate Sunday School baseball league to operate in the Kings Mountain area.

This league is anticipated to take the place of the R. A. league which operated successfully here in its initial season last year.

One reason to be cited for proposing a change in the league this year will be that more churches in the area could enter a Sunday School league since many do not have active R. A. Chapters.

Several members of last year's league have indicated approval of such a league and if Monday's meeting incites support of the league, rules of last year will be revised and a league commission elected to complete plans for the 1962 season.

Spokesmen for the group said that each Baptist Church in the area is urged to have a representative present for the meeting.

Last summer's league included Bethlehem, Davids, Eastside, Faith, First, Macedonia, Oak Grove and Oak View Baptist churches.

In other action of the afternoon Robert Plonk had a 46 to best Stan Ballard's 52; Donnie Freeman's 46 equaled Gary Hallman's 46 and George Plonk had a 48 to better Denny Dellinger's 51.

Jon Stotereau had a seven over par 42 to edge Oren Summer by ten strokes, while Dwight Swan shot a 50 in his duel with Ronnie Jenkins.
