RALEIGH, N. C. — Mrs. Terry Sanford has been named Honorary Chairman of the North Carolina Debutante Ball, it was announced today by the sponsoring Terpsychorean Club.

The Governor's wife will be hostess at a coffee hour for mothers of debutantes on Friday, September 6 at the Carolina Country Club. On the preceding day, she will be hostess to the debs, their mothers, and their marshals at a tea, the first official social function of the big weekend.

As she usually does for large Mansion parties, Mrs. Sanford is going to ask Fayetteville friends to help her. This time, Fayetteville debutantes Carolyn Averitt, Louisa Farmer, Ann Hambricht, Linda Kelly, Cornelia Johnson, Mae Murchison, E. Thel Perry, Suzanne Rouse, Julia Taylor and Frances Williamson will assist in serving at the Mansion tea. And receiving with the hostess at the coffee hour will be their mothers, the mother of the ball leader (to be announced at a later date) and other Raleigh friends.

The Governor's family will attend Friday night's ball at the Memorial Auditorium. For the occasion, Mrs. Sanford will wear a gown of pink chiffon topped with a jeweled bodice. Betsy, 13, and Terry, Jr., 9, will be seeing their second ball since they moved to the Mansion in January, 1961.

Mrs. Sanford, at 41, is one of North Carolina's youngest First Ladies. A vivacious brownette with a disarming smile, she has made numerous staunch friends from all over the state during her husband's tenure. It was through her generosity that the N. C. Symphony Ball could be staged at the Mansion. She is hostess to numbers of groups throughout the year who gather here for conventions, and a Mansion tour is always a highlight of such meetings.

"I'm really thrilled to be asked to be Honorary Chairman," Mrs. Sanford said. "It will give me an opportunity to renew many friendships I made while Terry was campaigning." Young Terry turned actor for a night in the Lost Colony in Manteo, when First Lady's night was noted by the producers of the outdoor drama.
