**Lewis Charged In Auto Wreck**

Robert Lewis, route one resident, was charged with improper passing Sunday following an accident on W. King Street which totally wrecked one car and took a \$300 damage toll to his vehicle.

The other car was driven by James Robert Ledford, also of route one.

No injuries were reported. Investigating officers reported both vehicles were advancing west on W. King Street and Ledford was turning right off the thoroughfare. Lewis attempted to pass on the left and struck the other vehicle.

Lewis' attempt to pass was done at a place marked with double yellow lines. Police reported two minor auto accidents Friday, the first at 1:40 p. m. at the intersection of Cherokee and Mountain streets. Involved in the crash was a

1953 Pontiac driven by Earl Dewitt Ledford, of 302 Waco Road, and Ellerbe W. Griffin, 310 W. Mountain street.

Investigating officer Charles Wallace reported Ledford was going south on Cherokee Street as the Griffin car advanced north. The Griffin vehicle made a left turn onto Mountain Street, hitting the Ledford vehicle on the left rear fender.

Damages involved were nominal, not being listed on the police report.

The second Friday accident occurred at 2:40 p. m. on Railroad Avenue.

Officers Robert Green and Charles Wallace reported Gerald Burris, of route 1, advanced down Railroad Avenue and struck a parked car on the left rear fender.

The parked vehicle was the property of Miss Rita Ann Falls, resident of route three.

Damage to Miss Falls' car was listed at \$30 while damage to the Burris vehicle was estimated at \$15.

**CHANGES IN YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY.**

Q — I am 30 years of age, am married and have 4 children under age 18. Three months ago I became disabled. Is there any payment to myself and my family?

A — Social security disability benefits are payable to any disabled individual who meets the following qualifications:

1) You must have worked under social security for at least 5 years in the ten year period before you became disabled.

2) Your illness or injury must be so severe that you are unable to do any substantial gainful work.

3) It must be an illness or injury which is expected to last indefinitely and will show up in medical examinations and tests.

Benefits may also be payable to your dependents, children under age 18 and wife. Such benefits are paid 7 months after the disability began.

Q — I am receiving old-age

benefits. If I move to Florida, should I notify you or the post office?

A — If you move, you should notify BOTH the post office and the Social Security Administration.

Q — Is it possible for a mother who is under 62 with minor children, to draw social security if her husband is receiving a benefit or is deceased?

A Yes. This is called "mother's benefits," and is payable until the youngest child becomes age 18, then all benefits terminate until the mother reaches 62.

Q — I am 67 years old and do not work in July of each year. I work steadily in the other eleven

months. Do I have to notify you, or will you send me a social security check for July automatically?

A — You must notify us to claim benefits for the month that you do not work.
