Miss Helen Hay was hostess to members of the Town and Country Garden club at the Kings Mountain Country club Thursday afternoon.

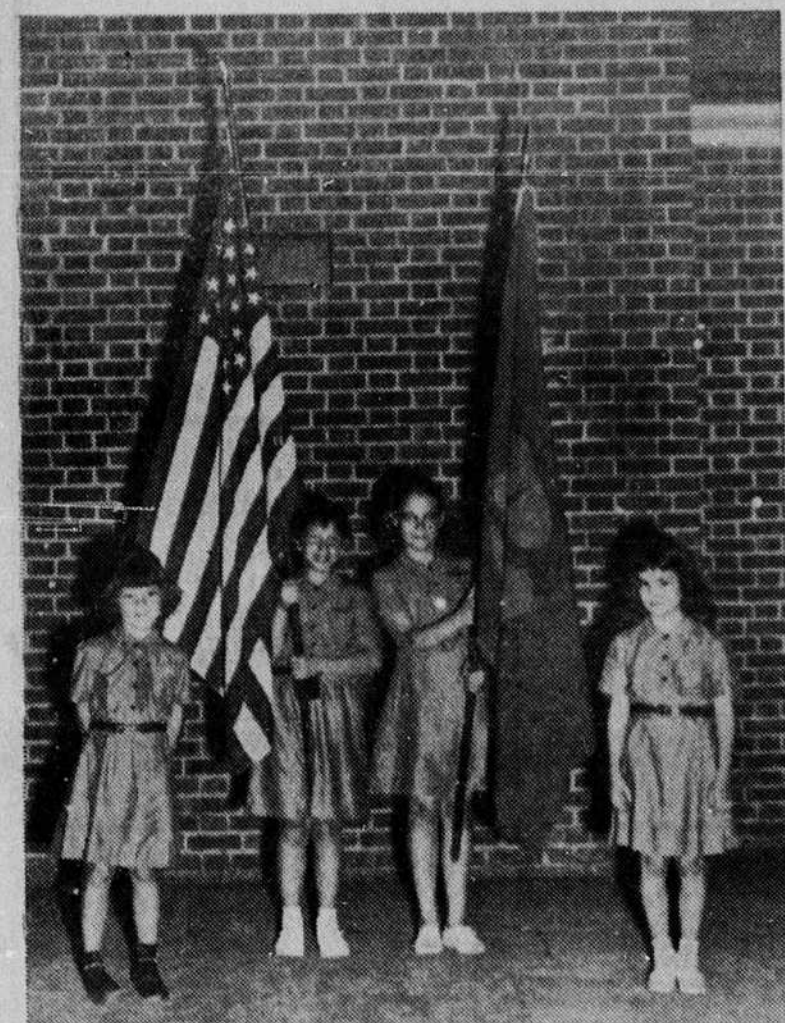
Guests were invited into the dining room where a frozen salad course with coffee was served.

Gloria's recipe for corn meal

- muffins:
- 1½ cups enriched corn meal
 - ½ cup enriched flour
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 3 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1 egg
 - 1½-2 cups sweet milk
 - 3 tablespoons, melted fat (Gloria used Sunnyfield pure lard and greased her pans with Crisco)

Directions: Mix dry ingredients together, after sifting three times; mix egg, milk, and melted fat and add all at once to dry mixture. Cook at 450 degrees for 20 minutes in greased pans filled two-thirds full.
